University General Education/Common Curriculum Requirements

The University has adopted General Education/Common Curriculum requirements in a variety of curricula areas that must be satisfied as part of every bachelor's degree program.

School of Nursing Requirements

Students in the School of Nursing must complete the following requirements in order to complete the requirements for a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree and to prepare for additional nursing courses in the junior year. Students should note that some of these courses may also be used to fulfill University General Education/Common Curriculum requirements.

Course Sequence

The recommend sequence of math, science, and nursing courses for students who wish to petition for admission to the School of Nursing is listed below.

*Seats in **Nursing 1130 and 1131** are reserved for students who have been admitted to the School of Nursing. Students who are not yet in the program will be able to add the course only on a space available basis. The courses may be taken in any order.

****Nursing 3100 is only available to students who have been admitted to the nursing program. It is impossible to progress in the Nursing curriculum without completion of Nursing 3100. Nursing 3100 is offered only in the fall semester.**

Admission Criteria

Students not admitted into the School of Nursing at the time of entry to the University may apply for admission through the School of Nursing School Change procedures. Students who would like to switch to the School of Nursing should have made substantial progress towards completing the freshman level requirements, particularly those courses that are indicative of their academic ability in math and science. Number of credits earned, total grade point average, math/science grade point average, motivational essay, and space availability will be key considerations in the admission decision. Admission to the School of Nursing is highly competitive.

Application Procedures

Students who would like to be considered for admittance to the School of Nursing should submit an application through the online system. Applications become available on January 1st and are due by February 1st of the academic year for fall acceptance consideration.

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
