Transfer Credit Evaluations

- Taken at regionally accredited, degree-granting colleges and universities
- Comparable in content and quality to courses offered at UConn.
- Completed with a minimum grade of "C."
- Must be found in the regular undergraduate catalog.

For Review:

- Utilize many resources to determine equivalency. As equivalency is established, rules are created in SA and the database grows

- Transfer Credit Reports are available to applicants at the time of admissions; Advisement reports (time to degree) are available at Orientation

Credit Restrictions

- Online courses in foreign languages, including those taught in a hybrid format, must be reviewed and approved by foreign language faculty before credits can transfer.
 - Asynchronous foreign language courses will not be eligible for transfer credit.
- Hybrid lab science courses that include synchronous in-person examinations and laboratory components would follow the traditional credit evaluation process;
 - Fully online lab science courses are only transferable for generic non-lab credit.
- When taking laboratory science courses, both the lecture and laboratory sections must be included in the same semester to receive equivalent credit at UConn.
- All Math courses taken during summer and winter are being referred to faculty.

Block Transfer

- Students who attend Connecticut State Community College (CT State) and earn an associate degree that has been determined as Transfer Oriented by UConn are eligible to have University General Education (Common Curriculum) requirements waived.
 - Similar to what we've always done for Bachelor degree holders.
- Please note that Block Transfer does not:
 - Guarantee admission – All applications are holistically reviewed for competitive admission.
 - Waive course prerequisites – Required courses must still be completed as specified.
 - Waive school/college-specific degree requirements – Additional criteria set by individual schools/colleges still apply.
 - Waive major-specific degree requirements – Requirements unique to a student's chosen major must still be fulfilled.
- Currently only LAS AA, LAS AS, and Human Services: Social Work AA are approved.



First-Year Student Credit Evaluations

- AP/IB/A levels
 - AP typically receive in Mid-July, automatically posted by rule.
 - IB/A levels are reviewed when received and typically posted during the first UConn semester.
 - Can be reviewed upon advisor request to facilitate proper class scheduling

- Concurrent/Dual Enrollment
 - Same Standards as previously discussed
 - Course numbers and titles must be consistent with the regular offerings described in that institution's general catalog.
 - Credit Evaluations typically completed before end of first UConn Semester.
 - Can be reviewed upon advisor request
 - Noteworthy:
 - Math at below calculus level is reviewed by faculty.
- ECE Courses
 - In conjunction with Academic Advisor/Registrar
 - Must be decided before end of first semester for most programs
 - Carries grade
 - When not used for degree, listed as non-degree on the transcript.

Transfer Course Equivalencies

The Office of Undergraduate Admissions is responsible for transfer credit evaluation. Decisions are based on the best information existing at the time of evaluation; revisions to course equivalencies may occur as new information becomes available. No transfer credit evaluation is official until credits appear on the student's University of Connecticut transcript. You must visit this site often and consult with your academic advisor for final determination as to how transfer credit might apply to your degree program. **Remember to refer to guidelines listed on the [Transferring Credit](#) page.**

As a reminder:

- Online courses in foreign languages, including those taught in a hybrid format, must be reviewed and approved by foreign language faculty before credits can transfer.
 - Asynchronous foreign language courses will not be eligible for transfer credit.
- Hybrid lab science courses that include synchronous in-person examinations and laboratory components would follow the traditional credit evaluation process.
 - Fully online lab science courses are only transferable for non-lab generic credit.
- When taking laboratory science courses, both the lecture and laboratory sections must be included in the same semester to receive equivalent credit at UConn.
- Any online MATH course taken during the Summer or Winter intersession needs additional approval from the Department of Mathematics, even if listed as pre-approved in the above table.
- If you are a current UConn student and plan to take courses from a Connecticut State Community College, it is not necessary to submit a Prior Course Approval
